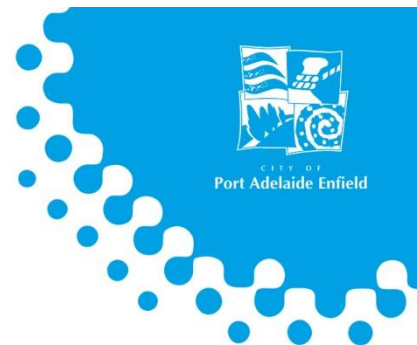


Heritage Strategy Engagement Summary – Stage I



<p>What did we do?</p>	<p>The consultation process included writing directly to the following stakeholder groups:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • owners of State Heritage listed places • owners of property within the Port Adelaide State Heritage area • owners of local heritage listed places • owners of 'Representative Buildings' (formerly 'Contributory Items' under the old planning system) • tenants of Council owned heritage buildings • heritage organisations • museums and selected business operators • relevant Government agencies • selected major developers <p>It also included consultation with the broader community via Council's website and the Have Your Say PAE platform.</p> <p>Both the stakeholder consultation and the general community consultation invited feedback on the draft eight key directions and the completion of an associated survey.</p>
<p>What did we hear?</p>	<p>The feedback on the Key Directions paper was very positive, with the survey returns describing all eight of the proposed key directions as being either 'very important' or 'extremely important'.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Council does a number of things well including heritage grants, heritage advisory service, plaques, protection of buildings and history walks – look for opportunities to expand or add value to • The draft directions were generally considered sound and were supported <p>Areas of opportunity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coordinated approach to supporting heritage groups, promoting and exhibiting heritage items and history resources, and encouraging bookable heritage tourism offerings
